Our parents live in the same village and we've stayed really good mates." Shane: "In the EastEnders episode that will be shown on the day of the Royal Wedding, Alfie rents a big 52-inch TV for The Vic and there's a party in the Square. But what's really great is that it is hoped the BBC will get permission to put in actual footage from the wedding, just hours before EastEnders goes to air that night."

If the pair of you swapped soaps, which character would you most like to play?
Shane: "I love Jimmi Harkishin's character, Dev Alahan, and the fact he always sounds like he's making his lines up. As an actor, you should always sound like you're saying a line for the first time."
Kate: "Jimmi's got great comic timing. He's so funny in the scenes where Dev plays golf with Steve. Even I've got a better idea of how to play golf than they have. But if I could be any character in EastEnders, I'd love to play Dot Cotton. I'd just sit there, smoking at the table."

Shane: "I tell you, you'd never get a sore throat in her company. When June Brown, who plays Dot, starts talking – you listen!"

What do you think would happen if Becky marched into The Vic and Alfie turned up in the Rovers Return?

Kate: "Becky loves a night out. It would probably take her a minute to adjust to the accents, but by the end of the evening she'd have a lock-in, the sun would be coming up and there would be a big old party. Whisky bottles would have been emptied and Becky would be serving behind the bar. She'd basically have moved in." Shane: "I hope the regulars would just turn round to him in the Rovers and say: "What kept you, Alfie?"

Do you ever watch each other's soaps?

Shane: "I struggle to watch my own show let alone Coronation Street, what with learning scripts and looking after my kids. And I only really watch EastEnders to tell the wife if I've done a good scene. But I've got a lot of family in Manchester who all watch Corrie. My mum is forever telling me what's going on in it." Kate: "I tend to tune in after I've met up with the casts of other shows at events like The British Soap Awards. It's when you see clips at those awards shows that you suddenly realise: 'Cor, that looks really bloody good. I better start watching."

Shane: "When Corrie did the live tram crash it was the nuts. We all looked at each other at work the next morning and were almost embarrassed by how good it was. It raised the bar, I think – not just for soaps, but for all TV dramas. That stunt with the tram was incredible. I swear to you, when we watched it at the National Television Awards earlier this year, we were all set to applaud Coronation Street being announced as Best Soap. You could
